**EASY TO FIND OR MAKE PROPS/MATERIALS** 

dance in, around, under, over the box; make shapes in the box, create a dance that Big Cardboard Box

starts and ends in the box; pretend box is a car, cave, animal den, boat, etc.

**Chop Sticks** Rhythm sticks

Crepe Paper Pompoms, streamers, multi-strand tassels

Elastic Waistbands or Sliced-up Stretchy Fabric Skirt (tie elastic or slice skirt horizontally in rings like Stretch between hands and feet to play with stretch, shape, even geometry calamari)

Feathers/Balloons Blow, toss and catch, dance with, stroke body parts gently, carry on head/back of

hand/between knees, etc.

Jump over one or more, go around, "Musical Hats", wear with personality! Hats

**King Size Sheet** Use like parachute, go around, go on, go under, jump on and off, while one group

shakes it, other children dance in it (swimming like fish in the ocean, flying like birds in

the clouds, rolling like earthworms underground, etc.

**Paper Plates** Balance and stack on head

Ribbon Jump over, walk and crawl under, pretend it is a tight rope

Dance with, toss/catch, catch on/with various body parts, "paint" the air, run through, **Scarves** 

cover over, lie on, etc.

Jump over, slalom around **Shoe Boxes** Foam Carpet Liner cut in Squares or Shapes

Create pathways or spots to step on, jump on, jump over, sit on, define areas

Plastic Easter Eggs filled with Seeds/Beans (glued shut)

Rhythm shakers

Thin Ribbons tied to Empty Masking Tape Roll

Multi-strand tassels with durable handle
